Message from Father Loomis



Dear Friends,

During the Advent and Christmas season, as a Church we ponder that silent night when a very pregnant virgin and her humble but tired husband sought urgently for a room to stay overnight, but there was no room for them at the inn. Each time we read this, the utter lack

of hospitality toward the family most deserving of our love pricks the heart and yields a slight cringe. Most of us shift in our chair. Perhaps we attempt in vain to break eye contact with God's gaze, hoping to feel the shame less deeply. So, why am I laughing?

Undoubtedly, the night of Jesus' birth did not find us at our best. But what of Jesus? He knew how this moment would take place, yet He chose to come anyway. To a people unprepared and a world totally uninterested, Jesus Christ imposed Himself in love. Bethlehem could not take Him, Herod did not want Him, and Jerusalem (which represents the whole world) shared his concern. But Jesus came anyway. His arrival wasn't convenient for anybody, including the Holy Family. Too bad. He came anyway, and I find His insistence hilarious. Knowing how often I complain, how I respond to God's generosity with stubbornness, and how I take His blessings so much for granted, I have to laugh. There He is, every day, unfettered by my obstinance and undeterred by my callousness, imposing Himself into my life. And I love Him for it!

I think of parents of newborn children who feel exhausted, under-slept, and burned out. Then the baby's cry asks for more. The cycle can feel brutal in the moment, but ultimately this demand of selfless care fosters virtue in the parent and yields the wine of selfless love by first squashing the grape of one's ego. This is easier when the parents have reordered their lives to meet the infant's needs, which yields a new thought.

Wouldn't it be better, if we just let Jesus in? If He continues to impose Himself, what if we just let Him? In this regard, Our Lady shines as a bright example. Never, at any point when Jesus asserted Himself into her plans or daily routine, did Mary prove herself closed to Him. Because of this, we have hope of salvation. I love that Jesus insists on breaking into our lives. I'd love it more if we all, including myself, let Him. Sincerely in Christ,


