My heart stirred within me as I walked down the paved pathway that cut through grassy hills to the old house. At various intervals along the path, hands were rapidly moving as different small groups of deaf individuals made their

way from one station to another. Our gathering at this scenic location was driven by a shared purpose: the Deaf Eucharistic Congress. The Congress convened in the beautiful setting of the St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Shrine, a sanctuary that encompasses not only a magnificent church commemorating her life and legacy, but also a museum, a retail store, and the historic buildings that once served as her school, residence, and final resting place.

So why the stir? Naturally, my heart celebrated to see familiar faces from the Deaf community while my eyes feasted on the scenic backdrop of the Maryland hills. The inspiring messages by speakers Jeanine Adkins and Deacon Patrick Graybill left their mark on my soul, and the life of St. Elizabeth whose bones rested in the tomb where we prayed filled me with awe. But



As the sunset on this incredible occasion, my heart stirred once more, this time with hope. 








The Annual Deaf Retreat weekend took place on April 25-27 at the Villa Maria by the Sea Retreat Center.
